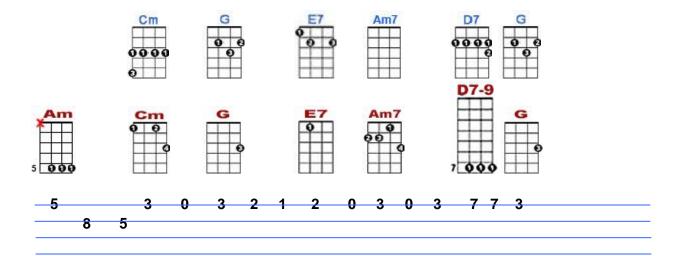
All of me, why not take all of me. Can't you see, I'm no good with-out you.
